

ASTORIA WRAP by Jen Hagan

Designed for the Knotty Knitters for Autism 2013 Calendar



Sample knit in Cascade Baby Alpaca Chunky, color #580

Finished Measurements

16" x 76" after blocking

Materials

- Bulky weight yarn, approx 600 yds
- US size 10 (6 mm) needles *or size needed to achieve gauge*
- Cable needle
- Yarn needle

Gauge


16 sts and 18 rows = 4"/10 cm in pattern stitch


Skills Used

Cables, lace, increases, decreases, grafting


Note: *The edge pattern on this wrap produces a pointed edging on its own, which can be enhanced by careful blocking.*

Stitch Key

 knit on RS, purl on WS

 purl on RS, knit on WS

 yo

 sl2 tog, k1, p2sso (CDD)

 k2tog

 ssk

 C5B

Chart B: Main Pattern

Row 1 (RS): K6, (yo, k3, ssk, k5, k2tog, k3, yo, k5) twice, yo, k3, ssk, k5, k2tog, k3, yo, k6.
Row 2: K3, p to last 3 sts, k3.
Row 3: K6, (p1, yo, k3, ssk, k3, k2tog, k3, yo, p1, k5) twice, p1, yo, k3, ssk, k3, k2tog, k3, yo, p1, k6.
Row 4: K3, p3, (k2, p11, k2, p5) twice, k2, p11, k2, p3, k3.
Row 5: K6, (p2, yo, k3, ssk, k1, k2tog, k3, yo, p2, C5B) twice, p2, yo, k3, ssk, k1, k2tog, k3, yo, p2, k6.
Row 6: K3, p3, (k3, p9, k3, p5) twice, k3, p9, k3, p3, k3.
Row 7: K6, (p3, yo, k3, CDD, k3, yo, p3, k5) twice, p3, yo, k3, CDD, k3, yo, p3, k6.
Row 8: As row 6.
Row 9: K6, (p3, k1, yo, k2, CDD, k2, yo, k1, p3, k5) twice, p3, k1, yo, k2, CDD, k2, yo, k1, p3, k6.
Row 10: As row 6.
Row 11: K6, (p3, k2, yo, k1, CDD, k1, yo, k2, p3, C5B) twice, p3, k2, yo, k1, CDD, k1, yo, k2, p3, k6.
Row 12: As row 6.
Row 13: K6, (p3, k3, yo, CDD, yo, k3, p3, k5) twice, p3, k3, yo, CDD, yo, k3, p3, k6.
Row 14: As row 6.
Row 15: K6, (p2, k2tog, k3, yo, k1, yo, k3, ssk, p2, k5) twice, p2, k2tog, k3, yo, k1, yo, k3, ssk, p2, k6.
Row 16: K3, p3, (k2, p11, k2, p5) twice, k2, p11, k2, p3, k3.
Row 17: K6, [p1, k2tog, (k3, yo) twice, k3, ssk, p1, C5B] twice, p1, k2tog, (k3, yo) twice, k3, ssk, p1, k6.
Row 18: K3, p3, (k1, p13, k1, p5) twice, k1, p13, k1, p3, k3.

Row 19: K6, (k2tog, k3, yo, k5, yo, k3, ssk, k5) twice, k2tog, k3, yo, k5, yo, k3, ssk, k6.
Row 20: As row 2.
Row 21: K5, (k2tog, k3, yo, p1, k5, p1, yo, k3, ssk, k3) twice, k2tog, k3, yo, p1, k5, p1, yo, k3, ssk, k5.
Row 22: K3, p6, (k2, p5, k2, p11) twice, k2, p5, k2, p6, k3.
Row 23: K4, (k2tog, k3, yo, p2, C5B, p2, yo, k3, ssk, k1) twice, k2tog, k3, yo, p2, C5B, p2, yo, k3, ssk, k4.
Row 24: K3, p5, (k3, p5, k3, p9) twice, (k3, p5) twice, k3.
Row 25: K3, ssk, (k3, yo, p3, k5, p3, yo, k3, CDD) twice, k3, yo, p3, k5, p3, yo, k3, k2tog, k3.
Row 26: As row 24.
Row 27: K3, ssk, (k2, yo, k1, p3, k5, p3, k1, yo, k2, CDD) twice, k2, yo, k1, p3, k5, p3, k1, yo, k2, k2tog, k3.
Row 28: As row 24.
Row 29: K3, ssk, (k1, yo, k2, p3, C5B, p3, k2, yo, k1, CDD) twice, k1, yo, k2, p3, C5B, p3, k2, yo, k1, k2tog, k3.
Row 30: As row 24.
Row 31: K3, ssk, (yo, k3, p3, k5, p3, k3, yo, CDD) twice, yo, k3, p3, k5, p3, k3, yo, k2tog, k3.
Row 32: As row 24.
Row 33: K4, (yo, k3, ssk, p2, k5, p2, k2tog, k3, yo, k1) twice, yo, k3, ssk, p2, k5, p2, k2tog, k3, yo, k4.
Row 34: As row 22.
Row 35: K5, (yo, k3, ssk, p1, C5B, p1, k2tog, k3, yo, k3) twice, yo, k3, ssk, p1, C5B, p1, k2tog, k3, yo, k5.
Row 36: K3, p7, (k1, p5, k1, p13) twice, k1, p5, k1, p7, k3.



Stitch Glossary

CDD (centered double decrease)—Sl 2 tog as if to k2tog, k1, pass the 2 sl sts tog over the k st.

C5B (cable five back)—Sl the next two sts onto a cable needle and hold at the back of the work. Knit the next three sts on the LH needle, knit the two sts from the cable needle.

Kitchener Stitch—Place live sts on LH needle. Align these sts parallel below the live sts on the other needle. Break yarn, leaving 10" strand. All sts should be worked below the needles. Thread the end through a tapestry needle and get ready to join the sts.

1. Thread through first RH st on the lower needle as if to purl. Pull yarn through and leave st on needle.
2. Thread through first RH stitch on the upper needle as if to knit. Pull yarn through and leave st on needle.
3. Take yarn down through first stitch on lower needle again, but this time, as if to knit, and take stitch off needle.
4. Take yarn through next st on same needle as if to purl. Pull yarn through and leave st on needle.
5. Take yarn up through the first st on upper needle as if to purl and take st off needle.
6. Take yarn through next st on same needle as if to knit. Pull yarn through and leave st on needle.

Rep steps 3-6 until all sts are worked off. Tighten the sts until the join is virtually invisible. Weave in end.

beg—begin(s)/beginning	LH—left hand	RH—right hand
CDD—centered double decrease	mm—millimeter(s)	sl—slip
cm—centimeter(s)	P or p—purl	ssk—slip, slip, knit (decrease)
CO—cast on	p2sso—pass the 2 slipped sts over	st(s)—stitch(es)
dec—decrease(s)/decreasing	patt—pattern	tog—together
inc—increase(s)/increasing	pm—place marker	WS—wrong side
K or k—knit	rep—repeat	yd(s)—yard(s)
k2tog—knit two together	RS—right side	yo—yarn over needle (increase)
